Reign Comment: Henry was a key figure in the Wars of Scottish Independence, a series of military campaigns fought between the Kingdom of Scotland and the Kingdom of England in the late 13th and early 14th centuries. The wars were caused by English kings attempting to establish their authority over Scotland while Scots fought to keep English rule and authority out of Scotland. It lasted from the English invasion of Scotland in 1296 until the restoration of Scottish independence with the Treaty of Edinburgh-Northampton in 1328. De facto independence was established in 1314 at the Battle of Bannockburn, a victory of the army of King of Scots Robert the Bruce over the army of King Edward II of England in the First War of Scottish Independence. Henry de Beaumont fought at the Battle of Bannockburn on the side of the English.

growth in power of the French Capetian dynasty during the 13th century.
