Fact Notes for John T. Hardesty

Name: Hardesty: English (Yorkshire): habitational name from Hardisty Hill in the parish of Fewston, North Yorkshire, recorded in 1379 as Hardolfsty, from the Old English personal name Heardwulf. Hardofsty seems to be the original spelling; later Hardisty, Hardesty. Meaning: Keeper of the Swine.
Death (27 Mar 1893, Dayton, Montgomery Co., OH): Death Record, Montgomery Co., OH, Probate Court: 1893, page 237, line 18. Residence, 1137 W. 3rd St., Dayton. Age at death, 52 years, 5 months, 16 days.
Religion: Churches the family attended: The family resided in the border area between Anne Arundel Co and Calvert Co. Churches attended are: Mt. Zion Methodist Church in Lothian, MD; Friendship Methodist Church; Mt. Harmony Methodist in Tracey's Landing, MD; St James Episcopal Church in Owings, MD; Christ Church in Owens, MD.

Death Certificate notes residence of 68 Forrer Blvd, Montgomery Co., Oakwood. (Same address as son Harry Hardesty. Harry is listed as Informant on the certificate.) Undertaker is J.S. Coffman.

Lillian May "Lillie" Hardesty

Lillie (Lillian) Hardesty is listed in her father's home in Dayton city directories prior to 1892. Lillie Stanley is listed in the William's Dayton City Directory (1895-96) as widow of Ernest, res 31 N Webster, Dayton. She is not found in later city directories or in the 1900 census.

Thaddeus Waltz, a descendant of Bessie Hardesty Duerr gave the following information passed down to him by an aunt, Florence Ruth Duerr (b.1896) in which she stated: "My grandmother, Elisabeth Von Neida, was born in August of 1841. She married John Hardesty (of Baltimore, Md.), who was a Civil War veteran... stories of girlhood in Penn. and Ohio... Grandma and Grandpa had nine children; Alvin, Harry, John, Lillie, Cora, Birdie, Bessie, Edward, and James... may have gone back East to marry in Baltimore... the Hardesty's were persuaded to move to Indiana where my mother, "Bessie Belle" Hardesty was born on a farm just south of Columbus, Indiana in 1876... they moved back to Dayton about 1891... Her (Bessie) oldest brother, Alvin, worked in taverns and restaurants; Harry went to work for Grandpa (Soloman Von Neida) at the United Brethren Publishing Company; Cora married a man named Baker and lived in Columbus, Indiana; Lillie married a man named Ernest Stanley and lived in Maryland. They had a son named Ernest, both dying very soon after his birth. Cora adopted the boy; brothers John and Ed also went back East and had a upholstery business in Washington, D.C...."

Harry H. Hardesty

Second cousin Carol Loy Butzer remembers visits with her mother and brother Doug to Grandpa Harry's home. I asked Carol what her memories of Grandpa Hardesty were and she answered: "Old!! I can

remember him sitting on their front porch. I don't think he was very interactive with my brother and me. Their house - how do I say this - was not very nice. I can remember the big front porch, but I don't think Gladys was much of a housekeeper. I'll have to ask my Dad if he has any specific memories of Grandpa Hardesty. It seems like it was mostly Mom, Doug and I that went over there during the daytime." "We must have spent a fair amount of time at the Hardesty house. I remember both Grandpa Hardesty and Gladys very vividly. Gladys was a nurse (I believe) and I think they had foster children."

Cora E. Hardesty

In the 1910 census, it appears William Baker is in Detroit, Michigan, married a second time to Laura, married one year, no children listed.

Marriage (17 Dec 1895, Montgomery Co., OH): Newspaper announcement has Marriage license issued to William (I or L) Baker and Cora Hardesty.

Death (02 Aug 1902, Sidney, Shelby Co., OH): Death record: Cora E Baker died Aug 2 1902 age 32 Clinton Twn, Sidney, Shelby Ohio, cause of death extra uterine-pregnancy.

Obit: The Sidney Journal, Aug 8, 1902, age 31 years and 11 months.

Mrs William S Baker, of Sidney, died of tubal pregnancy, after a sickness of ten hours, Saturday. She was born Hardesty in Baltimore, in September, 1870, and was married in Dayton in 1895. The body was taken to Columbus Monday for burial.
